

## **ITINERARY** - Tour to the Heart of Scotland

## DAY 1 - SUNDAY

Travel from West Cork to Scotland

#### Coach pick up points:

*Skibbereen 5am, Rosscarbery 5.15am, Clonakilty 5.30am, Bandon 6am, Cork City 6.30am, Fermoy 7am, Mitchelstown 7.15am.* 

We travel via Durrow to start the holiday with a "Full Irish Breakfast" at the Castle Arms Hotel, Durrow, Co Laois. With "comfort stops" along the way our coach will make one last stop at the Carrickdale Hotel, Co Louth to enjoy a light lunch and collect our regular "on-board" guide Barbara who will escort and guide us throughout the tour. We now travel on to Larne to catch the afternoon ferry (2 hour crossing time) from Larne to Cairnryan, Scotland. With free time on board you will have the opportunity to choose your evening meal, shop, enjoy the cinema or simply relax. (Please note that any refreshment on board the boat are not included in the package price.) From Cairnryan we make the short journey for a one night stop in the Premier Inn Hotel, Ayr, Scotland.

## DAY 2 - MONDAY

#### Loch Lomond, The Trossachs, Callandar

#### Distillery at Glenturret, Crieff Visitor Centre, Caithness Glass Factory

An easy going day with a short travel through the Perthshire countryside to discover Scotland's oldest Distillery at Glenturret home of The Famous Grouse Whisky. En route we stop in at the nearby Crieff Visitor Centre where you have free time to enjoy the wide range of shops, garden centre, licensed restaurant, gallery & antiques and history of the Highland Cattle Drovers exhibition. Not to be missed here is the world famous Caithness Glass Factory where, from the viewing gallery, you can see glass making in progress!

Our next stop will be our distillery tour where after seeing the age old process of milling, mashing, fermenting and distilling this single malt whisky and where visitors are introduced to The Taste Experience! Time also to enjoy the restaurant and shop on site.

We finish the day with free time in the historical town of Pitlochry (Baile-Chloichrig).

## DAY 4 - WEDNESDAY





#### DAY 1

## Newgrange Centre, Monasterboice Crosses & Hill of Slane

#### Coach pick up points:

*Clonakilty 7am Bandon 7.30 am, Cork 8.10 am, Mitchelstown 9.05 am, stop for breakfast at castle arms hotel in Durrow Co. Laois at 10.30am approx, and depart at 11.30am.* 

Travel through the historical & sacred Boyne valley region situated in Louth/Meath. A stop at the Bru Na Boinne visitors' centre Newgrange to view the exhibits, visit the restaurant and the souvenir shops, our tour will not be visiting the Mound but the centre will provide an excellent opportunity to view the Mound in comfort. We travel on to view the finest high crosses in Ireland at Monasterboice. On then to visit the hill of Slane. Here we follow in the footsteps of St. Patrick taking the short walk up hill to capture the panoramic views and where today the ruins of an old monastery still stands.

## DAY 2

Tour then travels over to Strangford where we board the ferry for the 15 minute journey across Strangford Lough to Portaferry on the Ards Peninsula. A scenic drive up the edge of Strangford Lough takes us to one of Northern Ireland's renowned period houses – Mount Stewart House & Gardens. We will enjoy a fully guided tour of Mount Stewart House with time to walk the gardens, lunch in the restaurant and peruse the souvenir shop.

### DAY 3

#### Belfast City & 100 Year Commemorations Of Titanic "Built In Belfast"

Belfast the capital of Northern Ireland and home of Harland & Wolff Shipyard where the world famous Titanic ship was built. 2012 in Belfast sees the opening of the impressive Titanic Centre and numerous activities linked to the birth of Titanic in Belfast 100 years ago. Leaving Armagh city behind we pick up the "brandy trail" as we travel into the beauty of the Mourne mountains. The melody and words "Where the Mountains of Mourne sweep down to the sea" of the popular song written by Percy French in 1896 have made the Mournes the best known mountains in Ireland. An area of outstanding natural beauty the Mourne Mountains were the inspiration for the writer C. S. Lewis magical land Narnia. In this compact range 15 miles long and 8 miles wide, only a dozen of the sixty or so individual summits rise above 2,000ft with Slieve Donnard at 2,796ft, the highest peak in Ulster.

After a lunch/shopping break at the seaside town of Newcastle the scenic route will follow the County Down coastal panoramic route. Tour travels around the harbour of Kilkeel on route with a photo stop in Warrenpoint where views of Carlingford Bay and the Cooley Mountains can be enjoyed.

In Newry we say farewell to our on-board guide Barbara and Northern Ireland.

### DAY 1 - TUESDAY

#### Travel Day with Breakfast at Clare Inn Hotel, Ennis and Visit Yeats, Co. Sligo

#### Coach pick up points:

*Skibbereen 6.20am, Clonakilty 7am, Bandon 7.30am, Blarney 8.15am, Mallow 8.45am, Buttevant 9am, Charleville 9.15am.* 

With all on board we make our way up to Clare Inn for breakfast at 10.15am approx and depart again at 11am approx. Our tour will continue up the west coast and into County Sligo – Yeats County. We will stop off in Yeats Tavern for lunch just outside Sligo town. Here we pick up our regular on-board guide Barbara and visit Yeat's country at Drumcliff. Leaving County Sligo behind we travel into County Donegal and Donegal town arriving at The Abbey Hotel, Donegal town at approx 5 pm. The Evening dinner at 6 pm and "Slice of Ireland" show in the hotel at 8.30 pm. This is Ireland's biggest Irish night an exciting production with the backup of Donegal Bay will include Haunting ballads, Irish airs from the piano, Violin, Uilleann Pipes, Bag-pipes, Whistle, Bodhran and Irish dance.

### DAY 2 - WEDNESDAY

#### Tour of County Donegal's Innishowen Peninsula & The Famine Village

After breakfast we travel out of Donegal town and through the scenic Barnesmore Gap picking up the Innishowen Peninsula at Burnfoot. We make a stop in at the Innishowen Gateway Hotel Buncrana for a light lunch before making our way over to the The Famine Village on Doagh Island, Innishowen. This is a traditional Irish Village in Donegal where the lifestyle of the Province of Ulster down through the years from the Famine of 1847 to the present day is reproduced in village layout. Before having a fully guided tour of the village we will enjoy traditional Irish homemade bread and tea in the kitchen.

Our tour continues right up to the most northerly peak of Ireland for a stop off at Malin Head (weather permitting). Many will have been to Mizen Head – now you travel to Malin Head. We travel across the penninsula to pick up the scenic route along Lough Foyle and home to The Abbey Hotel, Donegal Town.

### DAY 3 - THURSDAY

## Glenveigh National Park & Donegal's West Coast

This is our day to discover more of County Donegal. We set out from our hotel and our first stop is at Killybegs, Ireland's leading fishing port. Passing on through Ardara and the pretty village of Glenties we follow the Derryveagh Mountains and through the beauty of Glenveigh National Park (16,000 hectares) where we stop at the Visitors' Centre and enjoy lunch here before taking the scenic shuttle bus ride to Glenveigh Castle for a group tour of the castle. After castle tour there will be free time to enjoy the various well laid out gardens surrounding Glenveigh Castle and the panoramic views of the lake or simple enjoy time in the tea rooms.

Leaving Glenveigh Visitors' Centre we continue to tour around by Mount Errigal over to Gweedore set in The Rosses area where the well known song "Homes of Donegal" was composed. Over to the town of Dunglow we follow the coast road back to Ardara and through the Blue Stack Mountains back to our hotel in Donegal town.



About 15 minutes west of Clonakilty is the picturesque village of Rosscarbery situated at the mouth of a shallow estuary and steeped in history. Lunch will be served in the Celtic Ross Hotel at 2.30pm approx. This is followed by a visit to the birthplace of Michael Collins and places of note. From here it's back to Clonakilty where the group will get the chance to explore the town assisted by the tour guide. Evening meal and accommodation will in the family run O'Donovan's Hotel, Clonakilty.

## DAY 2

After breakfast the group will assemble at 10am approx and take the scenic route west to Skibereen passing the parazamic beaches of Red Strand, Long Strand and Owenahincha. Leaving Rosscarbery we will visit one of Ireland's best known stone circles Drombeg, dating back to the Bronze Age and from here onto the beautiful village of Glandore. A short time later we will arrive in Skibbereen and visit the heritage centre which hosts the great famine exhibition; just west of the town is the Abbey Cemetery, where the famine victims were buried. From here our tour takes us into Ballydehob and then onto Schull Harbour where we stop for lunch. Afterwards our coach will take us west along the peninsula through Goleen and nearby Crookhaven until we reach one of the highlights of our tour "The Mizen Head" this is one of the extreme points of the island of Ireland noted for its dramatic cliff scenery. Here we will visit the Mizen Head signal station said to be Ireland's most southwesterly point. Following a tour of the centre we return to Clonakilty for the evening meal at O'Donovan's Hotel at 7.30pm approx. This is our last stop before we make our way home to your club base.




#### DAY 1

We will begin this tour by departing from your base meeting point at 8am. Our first stop will be at the Clare Inn Hotel near Bunratty. Here will we will have breakfast before preparing to explore the west coast of Clare. We will travel through many scenic towns such as Ennis, Ennistymon, Lahinch and Liscannor. Weather permitting we may be able to stop for a short while and experience the atmospheres of some of these picturesque towns. Our next stop is the spectacular Cliffs of Moher. Here you will have the opportunity to explore the visitors centre before experiencing the panoramic views which the cliffs provide. From the viewing platform of the newly restored O'Brien's Tower on a headland of the cliffs views such as the far off Aran Islands and Galway Bay can be enjoyed. We will then travel on to the beautiful town of Lisdoonvarna where we will be served lunch at The Imperial Hotel. After lunch we will make our way back to the Clare Inn Hotel for at 6.30pm approx. You will now be able to check into your rooms and enjoy a short break before we prepare for the next event in our tour. The Banguet at Bunratty Castle or Knappogue Castle is an extremely popular and enjoyable event. On entering the castle you will be welcomed by a kilted piper who will guide you over the drawbridge and into the Great Hall. Here in the resplendent surroundings of medieval banqueting style including candlelight and long oak tables you will be welcomed by the Earl and Lady of the Castle. The four course meal is a pleasant balance of contrasting Irish meat dishes served during the period and is accompanied with music and song. After dinner, you will sit back, relax and enjoy the entertainment programme - a selection of Irish medieval and traditional songs and instrumental music. We will return to the hotel for the night at 11pm approx.

## DAY 2

After breakfast in the hotel, we will set out the next morning at 9am approx. Our first destination of the day will be the Bunratty Folk Park. Here you will have the opportunity to explore the castle and grounds in order to experience many aspects of the medieval lifestyle. After this we will return to the coach for a short drive to the Crescent Shopping Centre. For three hours approx you will be able to enjoy the many shops which are located in the centre. From here we will travel on to the beautiful village of Adare. Snuggled in a wooden and lush countryside setting, Adare is widely regarded as Ireland's prettiest and most picturesque village. The Heritage Centre will provide you with an introduction to the history of the village and point out many of its most important attractions such as Desmond's Castle. We will remain in Adare to explore its many thatched cottages and winding streets before settling at The Woodlands Hotel, Adare at 6pm for our evening meal. Here you will be presented with a number of different menu options before we begin the journey back to your base meeting point.



## **BOOKING CONDITIONS & OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION**

#### THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

#### TOURING

By private coach. O'Connor Bus Hire feature air-conditioning, reclining seats, onboard washroom and are configured with fifty seats.

#### **HOTEL ACCOMMODATION**

Prices per person are based on two persons sharing an en suite twin-bedded room.

#### MEALS

Breakfasts are served daily. Dinners and some lunches are included as detailed in the itineraries. Any special meal requirements will be made on a request basis only.

#### SIGHTSEEING

The following terminology is used on the itinerary in regards to sightseeing:

Visit - You will enter a specific site and any applicable fees are included.

View - A brief stop often with a commentary and an opportunity to take photos. See - You will walk or drive by the site so that you can see it.

A guide is included as necessary as detailed on the itinerary.

#### **BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE**

Baggage handling for one suitcase is included in the tour price at arrival and departure from each tour hotel.

#### THE TOUR PRICE DOES NOT INCLUDE:

Passport fees, insurance, laundry, 'phone calls', beverages, meals not detailed on the itinerary, items of personal nature, excess baggage.

#### **PAYMENTS**

The tour must be paid in full at least six weeks before the scheduled date of departure. If it is not paid for on or before such date the organiser shall have the option to cancel the tour. If the organiser exercises such option or if the consumer cancels the tour (which cancellation must be notified in writing to the organiser) the following cancellation charges are payable by the consumer to the organiser.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

In the booking form the word 'Organiser' means the person who arranges your transport, accommodation etc, and who offers it as a tour. 'Consumer' means the person who buys or agrees to buy the tour or any person on whose behalf one agrees to purchase the tour and who is listed on the booking form or any other person to whom you transfer a tour which the consumer has purchased. 'Retailer' means travel agent.

#### **THE CONTRACT**

No contract shall arise until the organiser has received the completed booking form together with a deposit or full payment for the tour and has issued written confirmation of its acceptance to the retailer. This booking form represents the entire agreement between the consumer and the organiser. The organiser reserves the right to terminate this contract if the behaviour or conduct of a consumer either prior to or during the tour is likely to endanger the safety or well being of other consumers in his or her company or that of the consumer himself. The consumer must use the safety belt supplied in the coach. The consumer is reminded that there is a no smoking policy on board the coach.

#### **PUNCTUALITY**

Throughout the tour, to ensure everyone enjoys his or her tour, it is the consumer's responsibility to return to the coach at the designated time, details of which will be given clearly to the consumer before disembarkation. The organiser does not accept any responsibility for any expenses incurred by a consumer who left behind. Every effort will be made to ensure this does not happen, but the consumer's co-operation will be greatly appreciated.

#### **ALL TOURS ARE SUBJECT TO SUFFICIENT BOOKINGS**

This means that there must be enough passengers booked on a tour to make it a viable otherwise the tour may be cancelled. In the unlikely event that it becomes necessary to cancel a tour for this reason, consumers will be informed as soon as possible. All monies paid by consumers will be refunded or may be used by the consumer against another tour with the organiser.

#### **CHANGES TO ARRANGEMENTS**

The organiser hereby reserves the right to vary any tour. This includes changes to ferry sailings, advertised accommodation, sightseeing and/or itineraries. This will only happen when situations arise which are beyond the organiser's control.

#### **TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF CANCELLATIONS**

More than 5 weeks before departure date any deposit paid shall be forfeited. Within 3-5 weeks of departure date, 60% of the tour price is forfeited. Within 2-3 weeks of departure date, 70% of the tour price is forfeited. Within 1-2 weeks of departure date, 80% of the tour price is forfeited. Within 7 days of departure date, 100% of the tour price is forfeited.

All cancellation charges apply to each person covered by a booking.

Any insurance premium paid is not refundable.

#### **SPECIAL REQUESTS**

Special requests (e.g. ground floor accommodation, sea view etc.) shall be communicated by the consumer in writing to the organiser or retailer at the time of making the booking. The organiser shall use reasonable endeavours to fulfil such request. The organiser shall be obliged to provide services only in accordance with special requests where the organiser specifically commits in writing to do so. No liability shall attach to the organiser for failure to comply with a special request which has not being confirmed in writing.

#### **ACCOMMODATION ON REQUEST**

Where accommodation is 'on request' an additional charge of  $\in$ 10 will be payable by the consumer. The charge will be debited to the tour price once a booking is confirmed. If the organiser is unable to obtain the particular accommodation requested by the consumer, the organiser shall take all reasonable steps to make a comparable alternative available to the consumer. If the problem is not resolved and the consumer has cause for complaint for any reason, whilst touring the following rules must be observed, if the consumer has reason to complain about the accommodation, food or service provided at any guesthouse or hotel that such complaint should be made in the first instance direct to the proprietor or manager of the establishment concerned at the time that the complaint arises, and shall, if the organiser requires, complete a form setting out the detail of the complaint. It is therefore a condition of the contract that a consumer communicates any problem to the organiser while on tour.

#### LAWS OF IRELAND

All matters concerning this contract shall be subject to the laws of Ireland and unless the organiser and the consumer agree to the contrary any legal proceedings shall be brought in the Irish Courts which Court both parties hereby acknowledge have exclusive jurisdiction in relation to any legal action brought hereunder.

#### **ERRORS**

The organiser has made every effort to ensure accuracy of the booking conditions and other important information however the organiser cannot be held responsible for the printing or typographical errors or errors arising from unforeseen circumstances.
